Big Data: The Important Dimensions

Big Data is a term used to describe the abundance of data sets, in various forms and types; structured, semi structured or unstructured, that comes from various sources; known and unknown, that are too large and complex to be dealt with (Miloslavskaya, & Tolstoy, 2016). The term big data analytics refers to the collection of data and transforming them into information that are usable and meaningful, commonly for decision making (Babanli, 2017). The history of big data goes way back before the age of computers and digitalisation where data were tirelessly collected, stored and processed manually (Miloslavskaya, & Tolstoy, 2016). During these times, analysis and results took years and required large amounts of man hours, since data processing was a painstaking, time consuming and expensive process. Nonetheless, big data processing has evolved over the years due to its significance in providing meaningful information to assist effective decision making. With the development of information system (IS), however, major shortcoming with big data has been resolved (Gandomi & Haider, 2015). Analysts are now able to collect, process and analyse data much faster and with ease.

To best utilise Big Data, it is paramount to understand the dimensions that are related to it. There are three initial dimensions of Big Data, which are volume, velocity and variety (Miloslavskaya, & Tolstoy, 2016; Gandomi & Haider, 2015). Volume refers to the magnitude of the data sets generated. For example, in the third quarter of 2018, Facebook had 2.27 billion monthly active users (Abbruzzese, 2018). If each of these users were to contribute just one post in one minute, imagine the volume of data generated within that minute, not to mention in an hour or day. Velocity refers to the speed of data generation, collection and analysis (Gandomi & Haider, 2015). Real time data are more valuable if analysts are able to catch and secure them while they are still new and relevant. Inability to adapt to the velocity could result in misinterpretation as the data are outdated, contributing to ineffective decision making (Gandomi & Haider, 2015). However, advanced big data processing technology that is available presently allows data to be analysed at the point of generation, which increases data accuracy and reliability. Variety refers to the different forms of data available to use (Miloslavskaya, & Tolstoy, 2016). There are three common types of data forms: structured, semi structured and unstructured data. Structured data are neat and related, and easier to process. Semi structured and unstructured data, on the other hand, are complex data, for example text, audio and video that requires additional processing to make it useful (Miloslavskaya, & Tolstoy, 2016).

Two more additional dimensions have emerged through time for Big Data; value and veracity. Data are only valuable when their use is able to meet the required objectives. Discovering the intrinsic value of data requires talent and specific skills, an investment that is worth every penny for organizations to remain competitive. Considerations on utilising valuable resources to collect and analyse the data have to subset the value the data will bring to organisations; otherwise the effort would be meaningless. Netflix is a good example of utilising valuable data to generate benefits (O'Neill, 2016). Netflix is the world's leading internet entertainment service with over 130 million paid subscribers in over 190 countries (Netflix Media). Netflix offers TV series, documentaries and feature films across a wide variety of genres and languages. Netflix gathers data through their viewers watching experiences, like ratings on movies, which devices are used to watch the movies, searches for movie titles and the dates the movies were watched. Since the year 2000, Netflix has been using CineMatch; a personalized movie recommendation system, which uses Netflix viewers ratings to accurately predict choices for all Netflix viewers (Netflix Media). To upgrade its service and performance, in 2006, Netflix offered a \$1 million prize to technology experts who could create the best algorithm for predicting how customers would like a movie based on previous ratings (Hall, 2017). The winning entry was announced in 2009 and the recommendation system influenced 80% of the content streamed in Netflix (Netflix Media). With the massive valuable behavioural data that it has, combined with its exclusive recommendation system, Netflix is now able to predict recommendations of preferred lists of movies for each and every one of its viewers, each time they login. By processing the right data that could reveal useful insights, Netflix has successfully utilised these valuable data to improve viewers experience, hence it saw an increase in subscriptions that contributed to billions of dollars of profit every year (Hall, 2017).

The second additional dimension of Big Data is veracity, which refers to the truthfulness of the available data (Gandomi & Haider, 2015). Verifying the data is one issue but the most important question would be, how much can we rely on the data? Having a warehouse of data is meaningless if they are of no quality and cannot be trusted. Imagine using a GPS with location data that are not accurate, you will definitely be rerouted to the wrong destination. The understanding of all the five dimensions of big data is extremely important to data analysts and organisations as only then are they able to produce meaningful output for the overwhelming data that are getting bigger day by day.

Making Visiting the Mosque Easier for Those on the

Autistic Spectrum

Isolation can be debilitating for sociable people but for at least 67 million people who suffer from autism worldwide, that isolation can become a lifelong issue. One in every 88 children is estimated to suffer from some degree of autism and the society is trying to improve the understanding of the disorder among the general public, who often think such children are simply naughty or misbehaving. Therefore, to avoid negative perceptions from the public, most Muslim parents will not bring their autistic children to the mosque. However, visiting the mosque is an important part of the lives of Muslims. The mosque is not only a place to pray in congregation, but to learn, partake in community activities, seek help, and connect with other Muslims. Unfortunately, visiting the mosque can be very difficult for people with the Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) and their families. Some families have even stopped going to the mosque as it has become too difficult to do so.

A program called Autism Friendly Mosque was initiated by RIG Sustaining Quality of Life, FBM UiTM together with several NGOs and mosques all over Malaysia as part of community engagement research. As part of this initiative, more than 45 autistic children as well as their parents were invited to join these programs since April 2018 together with more than 50 volunteers. Several activities involving these children and their parents included lessons on performing prayers, reading IQRA and Wudu'.

From these activities, it is hoped that society will accept those in such spectrums and provide more attention in figuring out ways to communicate with them better. Believing that all people are born different but equal and valuable, it is hoped that the Autism Friendly Mosque program achieves its objectives specially to encourage Muslim parents to bring their autistic children to the mosque so that they can enjoy equal and harmonious lives. From a different perspective, it is hoped that these community service responsibility project serves as a platform for the university staff and students to engage in the needs to care for those around us exclusively the minority community such as children with special needs and other minority groups so that they will know how to reach these groups and eventually help them or support them in improving their quality of life.
